

### SET ON REPEAT

#### CASEY DEARY AND DOWN RIGHT AMAZING NAB SECOND TAPH TITLE

Part concert, part horse show. Putting the atmosphere of Teton Ridge's The American Performance Horseman into words is as challenging as the competition that took place on what's normally the baseball diamond of Globe Life Field on March 8.

TAPH debuted in 2023, a competition that brought together the year's winningest riders of the National Reining Horse Association, the National Reined Cow Horse Association, and the National Cutting Horse Association to compete in a unique team format.

With an incredible \$1,000,000 in prize money on the line, the competition thrilled the crowd of thousands.

First up was the cutters of the NCHA, and it was reigning champion Adan Banuelos, riding for Team Royal Blue, who clinched the event win with a score of 230 on Storyteler.

After an intermission with a performance from Ghost Hounds, a jazz-infused rock band, it was time for the reining. The five contestants executed Pattern 10, one of the most exciting patterns of the NRHA, which begins with the signature sliding stop of reining horses.

It was also a repeat from another member of Team Royal Blue, as 2023 Champions Casey Deary and Down Right Amazing rocked the house and took the win with a score of 226.5.

Finally, the evening wrapped up with the cow work of the reined cow horse competition, and it was Corey Cushing and SJR Talkin Diamonds who took the win with a 220.5. Cushing rode for Team Burnt Orange.

Thanks to Banuelos and Deary's wins, Team Royal Blue, including NRCHA trainer Clayton Edsall, was victorious in the team competition.

"The team deal was great, and I really get along well with Adan and Clayton," Deary said. "Clayton came over and rode with me, and Adan has been over in years past getting ready for the World's Greatest Horseman, so I knew both of them already. It made a really cool dynamic this year."

Deary laughed, and added, "Plus, we had three of the prettiest wives there with us."

For the Weatherford, Texas, trainer, the repeat victory was special on many levels. "Obviously, I love to win, and that's a big part of it. The prize money feeds a lot of people and creates a lot of opportunities and jobs," he said. "But to show that horse off and prove to the world that he continues to be great is what means the most."

#### **Amazing**

Down Right Amazing, a 7-year-old stallion owned by DAG Ventures LLC, is by NRHA 14 Million Dollar Sire Gunner and out of Shesouttayourleague, the mare who gave Deary his first NRHA Futurity L4 Open Championship.

Deary and Down Right Amazing have amassed earnings of more than \$730,000, including four \$100,000 wins.

"There are some horses with earnings like him, but they've won the Futurity or The Run For A Million. His biggest checks have been



\$100,000, and he's still won that much. I think that speaks volumes for him," Deary said. "This horse is great-minded. He trusts me, and nothing bothers him. He's got the ability to acclimate to whatever situation you put him in and will adapt to any ground."

That adaptability is likely one of the factors that helped the pair clinch the win, as heavy rains prior to the event meant the dirt of Globe Life was stickier than typically found at a reining.

"We had so much rain that it never really dried out, but I think that the Kiser team did an amazing job getting it ready for us to compete," Deary said.

Noting that Down Right Amazing is a veteran show horse, Deary said, "Backing up in the very beginning he thought about rolling back. We could have started our right turnaround a little better, but the left turnaround he caught up and stepped really well.

"I thought he circled good for me. He ran and stopped ok the first time and was really, really good with the second stop and rollback. The third rundown, he took me to the wall just a little bit, but he stopped really good. This horse is so talented and so strong that he can make that adjustment and still get the mark."

He paused and added, "It felt like all five of

us guys had some trouble, and it was iust about who could manage it the best."

#### **Gratitude**

As always, Deary took time to thank the many people who have helped him and his team be successful, including he vets, horse shoer, equine dentists, and assistants.

He also added a few special thank yous.

"First and foremost, it's only by the grace of God that I'm here to compete. His blessings over my family continue to amaze me, and I think he gives me a platform to show Christ's love to people around me," he said.

Next, he gave credit to his wife, Nicole. He said, "She is the biggest driving factor of our business. She has pushed me farther than I ever believed I could do. Sometimes I was kicking and screaming, but she still pushed me, and her support is instrumental in the success we've had."

Debbie Good is the face of DAG Ventures and has always been a staunch advocate for her horse. "She is a great owner and a great teammate for Down Right Amazing. She has believed in that horse since the very beginning. We had so many offers to buy him, but she stayed the course and believed in that horse, and she's played a huge part in making it work," Deary explained.

Finally, he added a special thanks to the flashy stallion. "Of course, Down Right Amazing is the biggest reason the partnership we have works. I could have chosen a lot of different horses to take in there, but that horse has the ability and the mental fortitude to do his job in stressful situations," he said. "Without those four components, I wouldn't be where I am today."

### THE 2024 OKRHA RIDE & SLIDE

The 2024 OKRHA Ride & Slide, held March 5-10 at the Built Ford Tough Livestock Complex at Expo Square in Tulsa, Okla., has long been an annual destination for many of the industry's top riders. Originally designed as a schooling show to grow membership in the Oklahoma Reining Horse Association, it is strongly focused on grass roots members. The show offers circuit awards and its ancillary classes count for points towards the OKRHA year-end awards. The Celebration of Champions Banquet, held each year in February, will be awarding Kyle Tack saddles to year-end champions in seven divisions after the 2024 season.

In 2016, the event added Open and Non Pro Derbies, and this year, the added money in those divisions increased to \$109,000, making it an even more attractive option for aged event exhibitors.

"While a lot of time is spent schooling and prepping, our derbies have really come into their own. This year, we revamped our show schedule by putting the aged events at the beginning of the week," OKRHA Vice President and OKRHA Sponsorship and Media Coordinator Sarah Flarida said. "The main thought behind this was to not have those classes conflict with the American Performance Horseman competition in Texas. It seemed to work, as all of the riders who qualified for that event in the reining were at our show. As a matter of fact, our Silver Spurs Equine Open Derby had its highest number of entries to date (110 runs) and our Non Pro derby held strong as well."

She added, "Truly, this show has proven to be a right-time, right-place kind of event for us. Tulsa Expo Square is a fantastic facility to compete at, and their team is always great to work with, but with the recent relocation of the NRBC to this venue, we've had an even bigger turnout in 2023 and 2024. It allows people to get their derby horses in the arenas about a month before that event, test drive them, and get a better idea of where they are in their preparation."

The management team has wisely capitalized on that advantageous development and added additional paid warmups to the schedule including some in the Super Duty Indoor Arena which hosts many ancillary classes during the NRBC. Flarida said, "We have tried to develop some continuity for exhibitors, so it gives them every chance to feel prepared going into the rest of the show season."

#### Andrea Fappani Pilots Vintage Chex to the OKRHA Ride & Slide Silver Spurs Open Derby Championship

NRHA's All Time Leading Rider Andrea Fappani made the nearly sixteen-hour drive from his home near Scottsdale, Ariz. to Tulsa, Okla., and showed in the OKRHA Ride & Slide Open Derby. He felt that the show was well worth his trip. Along with the show's generous opportunities to ride and school horses though its multiple arenas, paid warmups, and schooling classes, the timing was spot on for Fappani.

"The fact that we are going to be back to Tulsa in about a month to show at the NRBC made it a good place to get the Derby horses back in the show pen again," he said. "Plus, I was getting ready for The American [Performance Horseman] so I was able to combine the trip and instead of going there with only one horse, I was able to bring a trailer full of derby horses and get them out on good ground at the Ride & Slide."

He showed two horses in the Silver Spurs \$26,000-added Open Level 4 Derby, but one of those did exceptionally well. "I wasn't even really planning to show Vintage Chex there," Fappani admitted. "He's a 4-year-old that I thought really highly of as a 3-year-old, but I don't usually ask these 4-year-olds to show hard against the older Derby horses. When I saw that he was eligible for both the Novice Horse and 4-Year-Old Stakes in addition to the Derby, I decided that it was a good opportunity to get him out and back in the show pen again."

Vintage Chex scored a 226 and won all three divisions earning \$17.527 for owner Bill Coburn. Having only been shown twice before, his previous experience included a pre-futurity in Tulsa where he missed the win by only half a point. Then going into the NRHA Futurity, Fappani felt like Vintage Chex was his best shot at the Futurity Championship, but, maybe, had him dialed in just a bit too much. Fappani said, "He took a couple steps back when he wasn't supposed to. I put my legs on him and he started backing up more. I think he thought he was in trouble because he didn't stop hard enough, and he just backed up more, so we marked a zero in the first go and never even made it to the semifinals. As disappointing as it was, I knew that he was a candidate to be a top derby horse going forward."

In Tulsa, the son of A
Sparkling Vintage and
Chex Out The Cowgirl
proved his merit. "He's a
very powerful stopper, so
I was able to show him
lightly in the circles and
really ask him for his turns
and stops to test him in
those areas. Keeping in
mind that I want to show
him the NRBC, I didn't

want to put a hard run on him right before it." Fappani explained. "He's a very stylish horse, and that arena really fits him well. He is a little bit bigger-strided horse, so he needs a little more space to get to his top speed, and that

arena suits him. I'm excited to bring him back next month and hopefully do well."

Fappani thanked Colburn for believing in him from the start. He said, "Bill Colburn has had horses in my program since I first went WorldWideSlide.com

out on my own and it's nice to partner up with people that have believed in you from the beginning and to be able to do good for them.

"From the outside looking in, it seems like I always show for these big breeders like the Arceses or Teton Ridge, but the foundation of my program is small-time breeders that might only breed a few handfuls a year. They put their young horses in our hands and that's what our program is based on. We wouldn't be where we are without the people that have supported us from the beginning.

"They breed these few horses and bring the yearlings in, and you know, more times than not it doesn't work out, so my hat goes off to them for being passionate about it. They are not just looking at the bottom dollar, but have a passion for raising good horses and supporting the programs they believe in."

#### **Close Friends Monica Mathison & Mandy McCutcheon Share OKRHA Ride & Slide Non Pro Derby Championship**

Monica Mathison and Mandy McCutcheon have been friends since they were in their teens, both are heavily involved in the reining industry and have husbands who train reining horses. Over the years, they have shared many things including lot of laughs and good times and, likely, a trial or tribulation along the way, but never before have they been cochampions, until the 2024 OKRHA Ride & Slide Non Pro Derby where they both scored 219.5 and tied for the Level 4 Championship.

Mathison said, "I can count on my hands the number of times I've managed to beat Mandy, so tying with her is pretty special, because I look up to her a lot. It's a goal for me to try to beat the best, and she's one of the best."

McCutcheon shared her sentiment. She said, "I love to see Monica do well! That's a great mare and she and Gunny really love her, so it's really fun to watch and to be a part of their journey."

McCutcheon is NRHA's leading Non Pro rider with more than \$3 Million in earnings. She is the daughter of NRHA Hall of Famers Tim & Colleen McQuay and is married to

NRHA \$2 Million Rider Tom McCutcheon. Her son is NRHA Two Million Dollar Rider Cade McCutcheon, and her daughter, Carlee, is very successful in the Hunter/Jumper realm.

With nearly \$118,500 in NRHA earnings, Mathison supports her husband, NRHA Million Dollar Rider Justin "Gunny" Mathison, in his career and runs her own highly successful embroidery business, well-known in the reining industry as Just Stitch It, and shows horses when she can. Mathison recently reached a place in her life that has allowed her to get more serious about showing, and mounted on Girlz On Fire, her come back is blazing.

The mare is by Inferno Sixty Six out of Gotta Git Ya Dun. "She is a unicorn. She's unbelievable," a starstruck Mathison said of her 6-year-old mare. "We bred and raised her, and Gunny trained her and showed her as a 3-year-old. I got to show her as a 4-year-old, then Gunny and Luca Fappani showed her last year. Luca was eligible for the levels 2, 3 and 4, and he did well on her. Now I get to show her this year, so far. I am very lucky. She is a great mare. I can't say enough good about her."

This gushing response was after Girlz On Fire, also called "Tyra," carried Mathison to a 219.5 and not only won the co-championship in the Level 4 Non Pro Derby, but also claimed the Level 3 and Prime Time Derbies. They were awarded more than \$7,900 for their wins.

Monica is familiar with her mare's particular style as she owns her dam. "I have not ridden any other Infernos," she said. "Gotta Git Ya Dun, her mother, has produced close to \$600,000, and she herself had won a bunch in the cow horse and in reining, as well. I was fortunate enough to be at the right place at the right time to purchase her from David Silva through the McQuays. She was a good show horse for me as well, and she's been wonderful, wonderful broodmare."

Mathison said that Tyra is similar to her dam in her confirmation and her laid back personality. She believes that Inferno Sixty Six's influence made her a more modern style horse with her naturally lower head carriage and the fact that she is "slower-legged." She said, "She fits right into the style of what today's version of the reining horse is."

In the show pen, Mathison and Tyra realized their partnership's full potential. Monica said, "She was there every minute with me. She waited for me and went as fast as I wanted to go. I had an under-turn penalty on her, which was completely my fault. I also blew a stirrup going down to the last stop. She got into the ground so hard, I popped up a little bit. But with me flopping on her neck, it just shows how good of a mare she is because she stayed in the ground while I half hung on her neck. She did her job, though. I couldn't have asked for anything more from her."

Mathison feels better prepared and excited to show the mare again in April at the NRBC. She thanked her "village," namely Gunny for his support and hard work with the mare, saying that he is hers and the mare's "biggest fan." She also thanked the many people who offered kind words, advice and support

at the show, including Jason Vanlandingham who helped her improve her body position in her turns. She also thanked both the Mathison Reining Horses team and her own team at Just Stitch It for keeping things running

smoothly while they show. She said, "We couldn't be more blessed for the people we have in our lives right now."

Of her friend, she added, "The thing about Mandy is if you ask her a question, she's

always willing to help. I mean, she was trotting around getting one ready as we were warming up together. She was probably three or four horses behind me in the draw. As I turned to walk in the pen, I looked at her asked if I should walk in or jog in, and she said, 'you can walk,' and then gave me pointers before I went in. I mean she is there to help you and I couldn't ask for a better cheering section."

The Ride & Slide Derby was the first time Mandy McCutcheon had shown Modern Starlet, so her game plan for the competition was just to let

the mare tell her how much she was ready to do. "I didn't want to ask her for more than she was ready to give. I just wanted to let her tell me, "she admitted.

By Modern Gun, whom Mandy's son Cade had ridden to great success, and out of Hollywoods Mae West, Modern Starlet has been in and out of the McCutcheon barn much of her life, but even still, has had limited showing. Cade owned the mare her three-year-old year and sold her, but as often happens, her new owner was too busy with work to show her. He eventually brought her back to the McCutcheon barn for them to help him sell her. Although many looked, no one purchased her.

"Everyone kept thinking that something wasn't right about her because she hadn't been shown very much, but I kept insisting that nothing was wrong; she is a really nice mare!" Mandy said.

Frustrated that people kept passing on the talented mare, Mandy bought her. "I've never had a Modern Gun before, but she is a strong turner and a big stopper, and that is ideal for a reining horse," she said.



Jennifer Greenleaf and Custom Made Whizkey claimed the Non Pro L2 Championship and were the Prime Time Reserve Champions.

Of the run, she added, "I felt like I got her stopped and turned quite well, but if there is anything I need to go home and work on, it is getting her to steer a little better in her circles. I knew she was green at that, even when not in the show pen, so I expected it, but when they horse show the same as they practice, I'm never disappointed. She was really quiet and easy. She didn't get nervous or anything, so I really like that."

Their 219.5 matched Monica's to share the L4 Non Pro Derby Championship. McCutcheon also claimed wins in the Novice Horse Non Pro Derby and in the 4-Year-Old Stakes. She pocketed more than \$8,300 for the wins.

McCutcheon has many to thank for her success. She said, "You know, it's always a family affair at my house, and Desiree Kelts did a really nice job on that mare. She rode her mostly from the time we got her back at the Futurity, until about a week before the horse show. She did all the work on her, so I really have to give her a shout out. She did a great job."

Like others, McCutcheon likes the OKRHA Ride & Slide for many reasons. "Heidi [Arvidson], Sarah [Flarida], and Kathy [Gould] do a great job of running that show. They really go the extra mile to make sure everyone is happy, and the exhibitors really appreciate that. Also, it is a great facility and now that the NRBC has been moved to Tulsa, it is a great opportunity to prepare your horses for it. I like to take the ones I haven't shown before to try to feel them out and see where I'm at to help

decide which horses will go to the NRBC, so it's a really good get-your-feet-wet, start-of-the season kind of a horse show."

Even still, McCutcheon doesn't plan to take Modern Starlet to the NRBC. "I think I'm going to save her for the 100X," she said.

#### MARTIN MUEHLSTAETTER – LEAD CHANGES

From a very young age, NRHA Million Dollar Rider Martin Muehlstaetter's heart and soul have been set on becoming a reining trainer. Although reining wasn't really a thing yet in Muehlstaetter's native country of Austria, his dream excelled, and the NRHA Professional currently has lifetime earnings over a million dollars.

While his 2014 NRBC Levels 4 and 3 Open Classic Championships provided his biggest paycheck yet - just shy of \$100 grand, the Scottsdale, Ariz. based



trainer was also 4th in the 2019 NRHA Futurity, won the Level 3 100X Reining Classic Stakes in 2023 and was 5th in The Run For A Million. He has been a finalist at every major event and has trained under some of the industry's legends including Bob Avila, NRHA Million Dollar Rider Dell Hendricks, and Todd Sommers.

Muehlstaetter trains with a very quiet, laid-back style that is easy to follow. In this video provided by our partner, Virtual Horse Help, he demonstrates how he ensures that he had proper body control in his horse prior to teaching the lead change.

# Non Pro Survival Guide with Shannon Rafacz How Do You Add Up?

It never fails that at least one time at every horse show I see a rider come out of the arena after their score is announced and looking confused and bewildered as to why the score wasn't what they thought it should be. It also never fails that their trainer answers in one word... penalties.

The most complete riders in the reining arena don't just clock time learning how to execute maneuvers and pattern placement. They also put their time in studying the NRHA rulebook and even more specifically, they learn all about the various penalties that can be assessed during their runs.

When I started reining, I was 12 years old. I was fortunate to spend multiple days throughout the week at the barn riding (every day in the summers). Each week, there would be one day where lunch was spent in the house watching videos. Charlie Smith had literally hundreds of videotapes just full of reining runs. We sat down and he would judge and we would scribe and then we would judge and get grilled on why we scored a maneuver the way we did. I can still remember my heart beating fast every time it was my turn to score a run.

I have heard it said that the fastest way to learn a foreign language is to go visit the country. The same can be said about learning our judging system. Incorporate our judging system into your riding. To do that you need to know it, have read it (more than twice) and then implement it. When you practice, have your trainer help you understand what your mistakes cost you and where you would be on the score card. I wholeheartedly think that I was able to sneak in more wins because I had the ability to keep track in my head where I was after each maneuver. I find the best riders are those who know what it costs them and how it affects their score when they miss a lead, over or under turn, trot out of a rollback, etc. They have the ability to keep score in their

head as they are showing.

For instance, I go to show pattern 6 and in my first set of turns to the right, I am looking at judge number three's baby blues when I finally get the spin shut off. I had better think fast about my next 6 maneuvers and how I am going to try and make up for that I-point penalty. That is upping your game. Having a general idea of where you are sitting score-wise on that judges card makes you a threat to your fellow competitors until the last maneuver is completed. As a rider, if you are playing the game but don't know all of the rules, then you are missing out on the strategic part of learning how to win.

I realize that sitting down with the rule book doesn't sound like the most fun way to spend your time however, that "bible" literally hands you, the rider, the judge's expectations of you. As a coach, I want to be able to challenge you to know what that mistake cost you. This also helps a nervous rider become more focused.

It captures your brain and gives it less time to worry about the act of going and showing and more on the job at hand. We will talk more about nerves in upcoming articles but giving yourself more substance to focus on gives your body less time to tense up about walking through the in-gate.


In addition to practice, if you can learn how to scribe and then spend some time scribing or volunteering at your local affiliate, do it! The time spent just listening to scores and penalties being called by the judges ride after ride is invaluable. If you don't have the time to commit to scribing, you never have to look far when attending a show to find an NRHA judge who may be there competing. Don't ever be afraid to ask them questions about a run. You may not be able to talk to the judge in the arena, but you can bet there is one nearby that would be happy to evaluate your latest show video. Judges are passionate about their job and the chance to show someone where they could improve is paramount to them.


If a trainer has a group of riders in at the same time, they are never afraid to turn a lesson into a mini clinic. We trainers put our riders on the spot to execute various maneuvers and then quiz the others there on what they marked and why. Putting riders on the spot in practice is a great way to elevate their heart rates. It creates the nerves they get when they walk in the arena. It's an opportunity to coach them on what they

should be thinking about and if a penalty is incurred, how to overcome the deficit. The opportunity to teach is always there!

Finally, as I write this conclusion, I am sitting on an airplane heading home from my very first NRHA Judges applicant seminar. My best advice is don't be like me. Don't wait this long to find one of these seminars to attend. Some affiliates will host a Secrets of Judging in your area. If you have any interest in hosting one, please reach out to Director of Judges Patti Carter and the committee can help you plan one! You can also apply to attend and/ or audit the seminars held in Oklahoma City. These past two days have been extremely informative as a rider and a coach. Looking at patterns from the judges chair showed me perspectives that I didn't always take into consideration before. I may have known every penalty in the book, but each penalty was further defined through the seminar. The execution and expectations became even more abundantly clear to me. It just goes to show that in this business the education never stops and is always evolving.

I hope I have given you some food for thought in your coming rides. I hope I have convinced you to maybe pick up a little light reading. Most importantly, I hope I have convinced you to challenge yourself to raise your bar through knowledge! I Hope to see you all down the road soon! Good luck and go learn!


